She scored 28 points, grabbed seven rebounds, passed out five assists and had five steals in the win over USMMA. She followed it up with a 27-point performance against Drew, in which she also had six rebounds and six steals. She shot 94-percent from the foul line (18-19) on the week and hit 48-percent of her shots from the floor.

2007-08 Notes

Top of Conference

The Cardinals will have their work cut out for them this weekend in conference play. After a tough stretch to start 2008, CUA will now face two teams tied for the top spot in the conference on their home turf. Depending on their youth, the Cards will try to upset one of these squads in a hostile environment and get back on the winning track as well as moving up in the Landmark Conference standings.

Leadership

With the loss of two of three captains, the Cards have relied heavily on junior captain Jessica Schiavoni who is currently the only on-floor leader. With injuries to both Justine Gray and Kristen Linderoth, younger players have been forced to step into leadership roles on the court and become more vocal. The play of Kate Robinson in the paint and Kerry Confrey at the point has been obvious as others try to step it up to fill the large voids left by Gray and Linderoth.

Landmark Games

This weekend marks the first Landmark Conference doubleheader for the Cardinals. After facing their travel partner, Goucher, in December it is the start of the second season for CUA as they will take on each conference team twice in a doubleheader weekend concluding with a single game at Goucher. Both games this weekend will begin a new series and a new conference rivalry for the Cards.

Ranked Opponents

Despite some tough losses this season, the Cardinals seem to play up to their competition after two impressive games. CUA faced the #1 team in the nation in early December and despite losing, the Cards played a solid game with Kristen Linderoth notching one of her best games of the season. The junior had 24 points facing All-American Liz Hickey in the paint. On Tuesday the Cards played another undefeated team in the #14 Randolph-Macon Yellow Jackets. Once again CUA didn't back down leading through the entire first half and forcing the Yellow Jackets down to the wire to win it at the line. In this contest the Cardinal defense forced 19 turnovers and had 14 steals. Kerri Confrey and Kelly Ryan led the Cards with 14 points each.

Undefeated Opponent

Tuesday's game marks the second time this season the Cards will face an undefeated opponent in the #14 Randolph-Macon Yellow Jackets. Earlier this year CUA took on #1 Mary Washington who had no losses at the time of the contest. The Cards lost that game but played one of the best of their season despite a number of injuries. Ailments will once again hamper CUA on Tuesday but they are hoping to put together a similar performance.

McPeak's Play

Lauren McPeak has added a lot to the Cardinal front court so far this season. With her 6-2 stature she has managed 6.8 PPG, 6.8 RPG and 12 blocks on the year. Against Stockton, McPeak was the leading scorer notching her first career double-double with 10 points and as many rebounds.

Stockton History

Head Coach Margaret Carey has extra motivation to get the win on Saturday as she returns to Richard Stockton where she was an assistant coach for four seasons. She will be coaching against her former mentor Joe Fussner as well as a number of players she helped recruit for the Ospreys. Carey has yet to beat her past squad as head coach for the Cardinals in their recent two-game series.

Freshman Fun

With no seniors on the roster the Cards are relying heavily on freshman to score, rebound and defend. Many have stepped into starting roles without any transition period to the college game. Currently freshman Brianna Peterson is leading the squad in scoring with Kaitlyn O'Keefe and Lauren McPeak ranking in the top five. O'Keefe and McPeak also rank one and two in rebounding proving how valuable these first year players are to the squad.

Double-Double

Kristen Linderoth registered both her's and the squad's first double-double of the season in the Cardinals' final contest before the holiday break. Linderoth scored 15 points and had 10 rebounds in 36 minutes on the court. Though it was her first double-double of the season, she is no stranger to the feat as Linderoth posted a pair of games last season before an injury ended 2006-07 for her.

Break

The Cardinals return to action on December 29 against Neumann hoping to start fresh after a long holiday break. Despite its 5-2 record, the Cards were battling a number of injuries some to key players. With a week off and plenty of rest, the Cardinals are hoping to enter the second half of the season reenergized. The coaching staff will now have to decide whether or not to sit some players allowing more time to heal before the start of conference play or to get them some minutes before tougher games down the road.

2007-08 Notes

Leading Linderoth

Kristen Linderoth had one of her best games of the season thus far against the top ranked team in the nation last Saturday. Going up against all-American Liz Hickey, Linderoth still managed to score going off for a season-high 24 points. This is just one point below her career-high and proved to many that the junior can hold her own against some of the best in the country.

Winter Break

After Sunday's game, the Cards will have their longest break of the season before returning to the court on December 29th against Neumann. With finals complete CUA will have time to go home for the holidays before returning to prepare for the final game of 2007. The extended break will allow players to tend to any nagging injuries and provide rest before the rigorous two months of conference play. After Neumann, the Cards have just four more non-conference games as they get into the meat of the conference schedule.

Rankings

Mary Washington will be the first ranked team that the Cards will face this season and CUA will have their work cut out for them. The Eagles are currently ranked #1 in the nation and have not moved from that spot in the last two weeks. Last season, played three games versus ranked teams but fell in all three. CUA faced #1 Scranton and Mary Washington when they were both #10 and #20.

CAC Opponent

Mary Washington will be the first Capital Athletic Conference opponent the Cards will face this season. On Wednesday they played Goucher, but the Gophers can no longer be considered CAC since they too moved to the Landmark Conference. UMW will join is the lone former rival that the Cards have kept on the schedule. Later this season, CUA will play Villa Julie who moved into the CAC during the shifting.

First Landmark contest

Wednesday's contest marks the first Landmark Conference game for the Cardinals. Oddly enough, their first game is versus a familiar foe in CAC-rival Goucher who left the Capital Athletic Conference with CUA. The Gophers and Cards will be travel partners in the new conference meaning on Landmark doubleheader weekends, the schools will play two teams on opposite nights. Opponents will do the same as CUA and Goucher will face the same two teams at home on a conference weekend.

Gopher Info

CUA has faced off against Goucher since early in program history and holds a 29-13 advantage in the all-time series. Despite their close proximity to each other, the Gophers are not one of CUA's longest series opponents. Gallaudet, Mary Washington, Marymount, St. Mary's, Salisbury and York all have played more games against the Cards. One of the reasons for this disparity may be because the Gophers did not join the CAC until 1991 where they would be committed to two contests each season.

Peterson's Prowess

Brianna Peterson had a career game against Trinity last Wednesday. Peterson had 19 points in just her third start as a Cardinal. The freshman guard was 8-11 from the field with a three and went 2-2 from the line. She also had two rebounds and a steal posting an all-around solid performance. Peterson has been in the starting lineup from day one of the 2007-08 season. She is currently leading the team in scoring averaging 14.7 ppg as well as 4.3 rpg.

Boarding

The Cardinals are hitting the boards hard this year and it shows in the stats. Currently, CUA holds a 128-89 rebounding margin over opponents and is averaging 13 more boards per game. The Cards have 16 more offensive and 23 more defensive rebounds than opponents over their three-game span. Freshman Lauren McPeak is leading the charge averaging a team-high 8.0 rpg while Kristen Linderoth is at 7.0 rpg and Jenn Canale has 6.7 rpg. Linderoth has proven to be a force on the offensive glass with a team-high 11 offensive rebounds on the season.

All-Tourney

The Cardinals had two players named to the all-tournament squad after a 2-0 performance at the Rutgers-Newark Tip Off. Kristen Linderoth and Jessica Schiavoni were both honored with the award along with players from the other three squads. Linderoth led the Cards in scoring in the first game with 22 points and seven rebounds. Schiavoni posted a career-high 17 in the second game to earn all-tourney honors.

MVP

After playing behind a solid group of veteran guards for the past two seasons, Jessica Schiavoni has already proven that she can take on the role as one of the top guards on the squad. The junior was the second leading scorer against PSU-Abington also posting seven rebounds and led CUA with a career-high 17 points. Her two outstanding performances propelled her to not only the all-tournament team but she was named the tip off MVP for her efforts.

Court Order

Cardinal fans will see a new look this season when they travel to the DuFour Center. The Cardinals will play their first game on a new court against Trinity the day before Thanksgiving. While the wood stayed the same, it was stripped, sanded, restained and repainted for an updated look and feel for the Cards. This is the first of many projects that will be going on inside the DuFour Center in the coming years as CUA prepares for the Competitive Edge Campaign Phase II.

Young Squad

New faces will be everywhere for the Cards this season as they welcome 11 freshmen to the team. CUA graduated three seniors, all 1,000 point scorers, from last year and had some turnover at other positions which will move some of the incoming freshmen into major roles on the floor. Head coach Margaret Carey and her staff are optimistic that the new players have the skills to succeed and that the returners will be able to step into leadership roles that were occupied by Maria Rojas, Shannon Mertz and Jackie DeBorger last season.

New Staff

The Cardinals welcome three new coaches to the staff for the 2007-08 season but none of them are unfamiliar names to the Cardinal fans. Jackie DeBorger comes on as a guard coach after leading the squad for the past four seasons. DeBorger was a all-conference athlete who holds a number of records including career three's and is also ranked fifth on the all-time scoring list with 1,325 career points. Haley Jones returns after a few years away from the game and a post coach and Erin Bonner will come back after graduating in May to help with recruiting and in game coaching. Bonner was a player and manager with the Cards.

Linderoth Back

Despite graduating three of its best players last season, the Cards will see the return of junior forward Kristen Linderoth which will be a boost to the frontcourt. Linderoth was leading the team in both points and rebounds last season before going down with a season-ending injury. The junior is back for 2007-08 and healthy looking to start where she left off last season. With so many new faces, the coaching staff expects Linderoth to serve as a floor general and work with the younger players.
