STREAKIN' NO LONGER

Stonehill suffered its first loss of the 2007 season with a 30-10 loss at the hands of the visiting Iona Gaels last Saturday.

WELL, NOT EXACTLY

The Skyhawks Northeast-10 winning streak of three is still intact as they return to Conference action against St. Anselm.

HAWK VS. HAWK

Today's game marks the second annual "Hawk Classic."

SERIES HISTORY

St. Anselm holds a 5-3 edge in the all-time series. Stonehill, however, has won the last two meetings, including last year's 24-9 triumph in Manchester.

GET FAMILIAR

Junior quarterback **Cruz Parsons** (Signal Hill, Calif.) knows St. Anselm very well. In 2005 as a freshman, Parsons threw a school-record tying six touchdown passes against the Hawks in a 41-7 win in Easton.

RECORD SETTER

The 41 points the Skyhawks scored in that 2005 win is the most points they have scored in W.B. Mason Stadium.

UP BY NINE

Stonehill leads the Northeast-10 and is third in the country in turnover margin at +9.

STILL ONE OF THE BEST

Despite yielding 30 points to Iona, the Skyhawks lead the Conference and rank 12th in the country in scoring defense, allowing only 12.8 points per game.

NO FLY ZONE

Stonehill is yielding scores only 30 percent of the time when backed up against its own goal line, good for second in the Conference.

SHOWING DISCIPLINE

Under head coach Robert Talley, the Skyhawks are the second least penalized team in the Conference. In last week's loss to Iona, Stonehill committed only one penalty.

STILL ON TARGET

Parsons has now gone 72 passes without throwing an interception. His only miscue occurred on his ninth pass of the season.

BALL SECURITY

The Skyhawks have only turned the ball over three times this season.

DEBYE IS DA MAN, AGAIN

After posting a season-high 15 tackles versus Pace, senior linebacker **Mike DeBye** (Burlington, Mass.) followed that performance up with a 14 stops in the Iona game.

ONE TO REMEMBER

To put **Mike DeBye's** performance against C.W. Post in perspective, his solo tackles total of 12 is the second most in the country in a game this year and his four tackles for loss are third most.

WIDE OPEN ATTACK

The Skyhawks have used the big play to get on the board and keep the chains moving. They have eight plays of 25 yards or more.

ANYWHERE IS FINE

Of the eight touchdowns scored this season by Stonehill, seven have come from more than 10 yards, including a season-best 67 yard scoring play.

FIRST HALF ADJUSTMENT

The Skyhawks finally allowed first half points in the loss to Iona. They are still outscoring opponents by a wide margin (39-9) in the first 30 minutes.

RED MEANS GREEN

The Skyhawk offense turns it up a notch inside the opponent's 20-yard line. In five opportunities, Stonehill is five-for-seven with two touchdowns and three field goals.

ALL-AROUND THREAT

Sean Donahue (Plymouth, N.H.) has been a huge asset for the Skyhawks this season in the defensive secondary and with his special teams capabilities. He is 4-for-5 in field goal attempts and is fifth on the team in tackles with 19 stops.

STONEHILL FACTS AND FIGURES

LACES OUT

Sean Donahue also leads the Conference in punting with a 39.6 average. He had a career-best 63 yard boot in the loss to Iona. He has also put five kicks inside the 20 yardline.

BLOCK PARTY

Chris Palmer (Santa Barbara, Calif.) has blocked kicks in back-to-back games. In the win over C.W. Post, he denied a 39-yard field goal attempt in the first quarter and then in the loss to Iona he rejected an extra point in the second quarter.

CRUZ-ING ALONG

Cruz Parsons (613 yards) looks to be well on his way to passing for more than 1,000 yards, a feat that has only happened 10 times in 19 previous seasons. The last time a Stonehill quarterback threw for more than 1,000 yards was Brian Schidel (1,504) in 2002.

PRIMARY TARGETS

Cruz Parsons has tossed six touchdowns this season and all of them have gone to either J.J. Niamkey (Quincy, Mass.) (3) or David Pringle (West Haven, Conn.) (3).

WELL ON THEIR WAY

In 2006, the Skyhawks leading receiver had 26 catches and the leader in yards had 276. Through four games, David Pringle has 11 grabs for 227 yards while J.J. Niamkey has eight catches for 163.

PERFECT TIMING

A perfect storm could be brewing for the Stonehill rushing attack. Currently ranked eighth in the Conference in rushing offense (101.8), St. Anselm is the league's worst at stopping the run, giving up 262.5 yards per game.

DEBYE DOES IT ALL

Mike DeBye ranks third in the Conference in tackles with 42 total. Amazingly, of the top 15 tacklers in the NE-10, he is the only one who has registered a sack.

HOMETOWN HEROES

Jared Zanello, Jeff Cuqua and Kyle Griffin played together as prep stars at Walpole.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

Two players on this year's roster hail from the Golden State. Junior QB Cruz Parsons (Signal Hill) and classmate Chris Palmer (Santa Barbara) made the cross country trek.

THIS IS YOUR CHANCE

One area the Skyhawks have failed to exploit is their big-play capabilities in the return game. Senior J.J. Niamkey (Quincy, Mass.) has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns in his career. As a sophomore, he returned one 83 yards for a score against American International, then scored the lone touchdown in last year's loss at Iona. St. Anselm, meanwhile ranks last in the Northeast-10 in kick return coverage.

RUN RIGHT PAST YOU

Junior Torrey Price (Sleepy Hollow, N.Y.) made his first catch of the season in the loss to Iona. Also a member of the Stonehill's track and field team, he received All-America accolades after finishing sixth at last year's NCAA Championships in the 60 meter dash.

REMEMBER MY NAME

St. Anselm's defense is anchored by All-America candidate Casey Larson. Larson ranks 20th in the Conference with 30 tackles and is third in the NE-10 in Sacks with 4.0.

CHAIN MOVER

David Pringle leads the Conference in yards per catch at 20.6 per grab. Chris Bone of C.W. Post sits in second with an average of 16.2.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

The first two games of the season, at Assumption, home to Pace, were played on Friday nights. That leaves the Merrimack game on Nov. 2 as the remaining Friday night contest.

A NEW BEGINNING

Robert Talley, the sixth coach in the history of Stonehill College was introduced at a press conference on February 27, 2007.

TALLEY OF THE TAPE

A former All-America at Boston University, Talley graduated in 1991 with a degree in Business Administration and is the school's all-time tackle leader.

TWENTY TIMES

The 2007 season marks the 20th varsity football season at Stonehill College.

DON'T I KNOW YOU?

Head Coach Robert Talley and Offensive Coordinator Bill Polin were on the staff together at Dartmouth College.

2 OF 54

Of the 54 NCAA football programs in New England, only two have African-American head coaches. Stonehill's Robert Talley and Division III Becker College's Mel Mills are the lone members of that group.

2 OF 151

The NCAA offers Division II Football at 151 institutions. Robert Talley joins Wayne State's Paul Winters as the only two African-American head coaches in all of Division II.

SIX DEGREES OF SEPARATION

The Skyhawks defense went six quarters with allowing a point before Josh Amaro's one-yard plunge in the third quarter of their win over C.W. Post.

ONE AND DONE

There were twelve games between Mike Plichta and J.J. Niamkey's 100-yard receiving performance. David Pringle didn't let any games go by before he cracked the century mark. Pringle grabbed five balls for 128 yards and a score in the win over C.W. Post, giving Stonehill back-to-back 100 yard receiving performances.

ON THE OTHER HAND

It has been 24 games since the last Stonehill running back eclipsed the 100-yard mark. Cliff Mason II was the last to do it on September 4, 2005 against Assumption.

ON THEIR WAY

Stonehill scored 10 touchdowns in 2006. In four games this season, they have eight.

65 IS NOT THE LIMIT

2006 produced only 84 points in 10 contests. Four games in to 2007 and the Skyhawks have 65.

HEAD COACH ROBERT TALLEY



Fresh off the staff of the much-improved San Francisco 49ers, Robert Talley was introduced as Stonehill College's sixth varsity head football coach on February 27, 2007.

Talley, who brings over 16 years of coaching experience to his position at Stonehill, including 15 years at the collegiate level alone, will try to replicate the turnaround he helped maneuver in the Bay Area at Stonehill.

For the previous two seasons, Talley held the positions of Special Assistant to 49er head coach Mike Nolan and Assistant Offensive Line Coach, where he helped mentor a line that paved the way for a record-setting season from second-year running back Frank Gore. The team as a whole finished sixth in the NFL in rushing yards per game (135.8), highlighted by Gore's 1,695 yards, third most in League. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Talley served as a team liaison and oversaw the offensive playbook and game book preparation.

Prior to his appointment with the 49ers, Talley spent eight years on the staff at Dartmouth College, rising from Defensive Secondary Coach in his first three years on the Big Green staff to Defensive Coordinator in his final five campaigns. During his time in Hanover he developed All-Ivy defensive backs Clayton Smith and Steve Jensen, who was the 2001 Ivy League Rookie of the Year.

Only the second African-American football head coach in New England, Talley joins Becker College's Mel Mills as sideline bosses at the 54 institutions in Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Hampshire, Maine, Vermont and Rhode Island that offer NCAA programs. He is also on the second African-American head coach in Division II football along with Paul Winters at Wayne (Mich.) State.

While at Dartmouth, Talley spent his summers participating in the National Football League's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program, which provides training camp positions to minority coaches. Talley spent five summers learning from some of the greatest football minds in the game, including the New England Patriots Bill Belichick, Tom Coughlin of the New York Giants, Dick Jauron, formerly of the Chicago Bears and

Dennis Green, formerly of the Minnesota Vikings. At each stop he worked exclusively with the defensive line, except for his time with the Bears, where he worked with the defensive backs.

During the 1996 season, Talley was the Linebackers Coach at Colby College in Waterville, Maine.

From 1991-1996, Talley was a member of the University of Massachusetts staff, first as assistant defensive backfield coach (1991-1992), then as defensive ends coach and special teams coordinator (1992-96). In 1992 the Minutemen went 7-3 and followed that season up with a 9-2 ledger, good for second in the conference.

A 1991 graduate of Boston University with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration, Talley served as co-captain during his senior season in 1990 and is the school's career leader in tackles. A two-time All-America performer for the Terriers, he earned all-Yankee Conference honors during each of his final three seasons of play.

Talley joins Cliff Sherman, David Swanton, Connie Driscoll, Rich Beal and Chris Woods as Stonehill's head coaches since the inception of varsity football in 1988.

The 38-year old Talley is married to Sara Talley, an assistant volleyball coach at Stonehill.
